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

ADOLESCENT CHURCH ATTENDANCE



Attendance at religious services has been dropping significantly for adolescents (above) and steadily, though less precipitously, for the population at large. For the population at large, between 2007 and 2014 there was a drop of 3% for those who worship weekly and an addition of 3% for those who never worship, as reported in this <u>Pew</u> <u>Research publication</u>.
