The Face of Cohabiting Couples



Though cohabitation is widespread, cohabiting couples tend to be less educated, have lower income, have more sexual experiences before the age of 18, have children out of wedlock, and have serial cohabitations.

<u>Cohabitation Leads to Lower</u> <u>Marital Quality</u>



Women who <u>cohabited</u> prior to marriage experience higher levels of conflict, poorer communication, and poorer marital outcomes, including divorce.

Cohabitation leads to less commitment, more instability, and lasts less than 3 years, on average.

Cohabitation Increases the Risk of Intimate Partner Violence



Young cohabiting couples are more likely to experience intimate partner violence, such as physical and sexual abuse, stalking, and psychological aggression.

<u>Cohabitation Prevents</u> <u>Children from Flourishing</u>




Children from cohabiting couples face higher risks of family instability and poverty, weaker cognitive skills, and poorer physical and mental health compared to children from married couples.
