




Economic Advantages of Early Marriage

The famous <u>"Knot Yet" report</u> illustrates that those who marry early experience higher levels or personal *and* household income.

Quality of Life of Married Young Adults

The same report also demonstrates that single and cohabitating young adults experience lower quality of life than married young adults. The unmarried exhibit higher levels of alcohol consumption, depression, and dissatisfaction with life.

<u>Marriage</u>

Scholars from the <u>University of</u>
<u>Texas at Austin</u> reported (2010) that those who marry by age 25 experience higher levels of marital quality and marital success.

<u>Long-Term Relationship</u> <u>Quality of Married</u> <u>Couples</u>

A new publication by Amato and James indicates that relationship quality does not diminish over time. Marriages that remain intact experience long-term increases in shared activities, declines in discord, and a return to initial levels of marital happiness.
