### **Cohabitation is Patriarchal**

Cohabitation perpetuates asymmetrical relationships that allow men to emotionally control their female partner, <u>reports</u> British researchers at the Marriage Foundation.



### **Religious Practice Strengthens Social Bonds**

Individuals who worship frequently provide their fellow community members with more support and are viewed as more trustworthy and generous, <u>according</u> to a study of South Indian villages conducted by researchers at the Santa Fe Institute.

#### **Family Structure and Wealth**

Although family structure does not significantly explain racial wealth gaps following the 2008-2012 economic declines, married couples did maintain at least a 70% advantage over their unmarried counterparts, <u>reports</u> Robert Lerman of the Urban Institute.
