Pornography Hurts Interpersonal Relationships

Viewing pornography decreases sexual and relationship satisfaction, particularly for males, <u>according</u> to a meta-analysis from Indiana University.



Positive Influence of Fathers

Fathers' involvement in newborn care and fathers' support for the newborn's mother decreases rates of infant colic, <u>report</u> researchers at Pennsylvania State University.



Less Sexual Intercourse among Americans

Americans today have less sexual intercourse than Americans in the 1990s because fewer adults have mated, and even those who have mated engage in less intercourse, <u>according</u> to a San Diego University study.
