Importance of Religion Increases in Formerly Communist Countries

Central and Eastern European countries now claim a solid religious majority—mostly identifying as either Orthodox Christian or Roman Catholic—and view religion as integral to their national identity, according to researchers at Pew Research Center.



Marriage and Housework

Women who have a higher preference for housework and men who have a lower preference for housework are more likely to marry than their counterparts. This preference accounts for 30-60 percent of the increase in women's housework and decrease in men's housework after marriage, <u>report</u> researchers at the Institute of Labor Economics.



Fertility Trends

The number of childless women in their early 30s has increased by 4 percent in just ten years, <u>according</u> to the latest Census Bureau fertility trends.
