Increase in Nonmarital Sex

Millennial women are 11 percent more likely to have nonmarital sexual intercourse by age 25 than baby boomers (the "sexual revolution generation") were, report researchers at Bowling Green State University.



Grandfamilies

The percent of grandfamilies—families in which children live with their grandparents—has increase over recent generations. Generations United and colleagues have published state-by-state fact sheets about grandfamilies in the United States.



Interracial Marriages Continue to Steadily Increase

The percent of interracial newlyweds has increased from 3 percent in 1967 to 17 percent in 2015, hitting an all-time high. Asian and Hispanic newlyweds are most likely to marry somebody of a different race, though intermarriages have increased most for Black and White newlyweds, report researchers at Pew Research Center.
