Americans' View on Abortion

The majority of American adults (54 percent) believe abortion should be illegal, or legal in only a few circumstances, according to a recent GALLUP report.



Child Poverty Risk During a Recession

Children with unmarried parents frequently fall into poverty during a recession. Compared to Australian, Canadian, Irish, and British children, American children-particularly those with cohabiting parents--are especially hit by the poverty penalty, <u>report</u> researchers at Oregon State University and Carleton University.



Similarity between Children's and Parent's Values

Children of parents who prioritize pro-social ideals (helping, caring for others, etc.) over self-promotion (achievement, power, etc.) are more likely, as adults, to share these values with their parents, according to researchers at the University of Westminster, the University of Austria, and the University of Bern.
