Contraception Increases Breast Cancer Risk

Oral contraceptives significantly increase women's exposure to serum estradiol and progesterone hormones, thereby increasing women's breast cancer risk, <u>report</u> researchers at the University of Michigan.



U.S. Fertility Hits New Low

Fertility rates for women under age 30 in the United States hit an all-time low in 2016. Births to unmarried women also declined since peaking in 2007-2008, according to the National Center for Health Statistics.



Children's View of Fathers' Work

Although children generally support their father's work obligations, they become less understanding if their father's work time spills into family time in the evening or on the weekends. Fathers' excessively long work hours or mental preoccupation with work hinders his closeness with his children, <u>report</u> researchers at the Australian National University.
