Depression among Adolescents with Same-Sex Parents Adults raised by same-sex parents suffer from depression at double the rate of the general population, <u>according to Dr. Paul</u> <u>Sullins</u> of the Catholic University of America.



Condom Distribution Increases Teen Pregnancies

Access to condoms in schools leads to a ten percent rise in teen births, and an increased rate of gonorrhea among women. Kasey Buckles and Daniel Hungerman of the University of Notre Dame share their <u>recent findings</u>.



Religious Practice and Suicide

Women who never attend religious services are five times more likely to commit suicide than women who worship weekly, <u>says</u> <u>Dr. Tyler VanderWeele</u> and colleagues of Harvard University.
