Couple's Relationship Affects Parent-Child Relationship

Spouses with high attachment anxiety exhibit poorer marital adjustment, less co-parenting cooperation, and more co-parenting conflict, [report](#) researchers at the University of North Texas.



Race, Family Structure, and Poverty

Family structure and workforce participation explain roughly 48 percent of the difference in poverty risk for Blacks versus Whites, but only 4 percent of the difference for Hispanics versus Whites, [according](#) to researchers at Pennsylvania State University and Louisiana State University.



Married versus Cohabiting Families

Children with two biological married parents differ from children with two biological cohabiting parents in terms of poverty, health care coverage, parental education, and race/ ethnicity, [report](#) researchers at Bowling Green State University.
