PEW FOUNDATION:

In the next 30 years migration into Europe, at current levels of *non-refugee* migration, will likely grow the total Muslim population from its present 4.9% to 11.7%. Despite this influx of these fertile families, Europe remains below replacement levels.

ABORTION AND CONTRACEPTION

Caitlin Myers of Middlebury College VT in a 2017 research article concludes: "I provide new evidence on the relative 'powers' of contraception and abortion policy in effecting the dramatic social transformations of the 1960s and 1970s. --- [T]he estimates robustly suggest that it was liberalized access to abortion that allowed large numbers of women to delay marriage and motherhood." Her analysis indicates an interdependent relationship: first comes contraception, then comes abortion. Ireland, having accepted contraception decades ago, is now caving on abortion. The Irish are free to choose but they are not free to choose the negative natural law consequences of being a contracepting society, nor of soon being an aborting society.
