### The Essential Role of Fathers as the Spiritual Leader of the Family



A <u>Swiss study</u> found that if a father does not go to church – no matter how faithful his wife – only one child in 50 will become a regular worshipper. If a father does attend church regularly, regardless of the mother's practice, between two-thirds and three-quartrs of their children will become churchgoers well into adulthood. If fathers take their faith seriously, then their children will too.

#### Religious Fathers, Religious Kids Findings Transcend Race



A 2016 study found that among
African American families, fathers'
religiosity predicted their children's
beliefs and practices. This study
found that African American fathers'
beliefs were positively associated
with their sons' beliefs. An additional
finding showed that fathers who
practiced their faith were more likely
to have children who shared the
same level of religious involvement.

# Fathers Impact Their Kids' Religious Views



Research conducted over multiple decades found that fathers pass down their religious views to their children. In fact, this research found that a crucial factor in whether a child keeps the faith is the presence of a strong father-child bond.

## A Father's Faith Solidifies Children's Religious Identity



A Pew study found that a father who shares the same faith as his wife was more likely to have children who share their parents' faith. For instance, among adult children with parents who have the same religious affiliation and who said that religion was important to their family had a high likelihood of identifying with the same religion as their parents.
