




New Mexico Fraction of Families Intact





fraction of all births




New Mexico High school graduates, fraction of 19- to 20-year-olds



New Mexico Employment, fraction of 25- to 54- year- old men working




New Mexico Earnings, average per 25- to 54- year- old male




New Mexico Fraction of households owning home




New Mexico Persons below poverty line, fraction of overall population




New Mexico Persons below poverty line, fraction of 25- to 54-year-old females




New Mexico Persons below poverty line, fraction of minors




New Mexico Food stamp recipients, fraction of households




New Mexico TANF & state welfare transfers, average per 25- to 54- year- old female




New Mexico Social Security Disability Income, average per 25- to 54- year- old




New Mexico Social Security Disability Income, average per 25- to 54- year- old male




New Mexico Supplemental Security Income (SSI), average per 25- to 54-year-old male






New Mexico Public healthcare, fraction of 25- to 54- year- olds receiving
