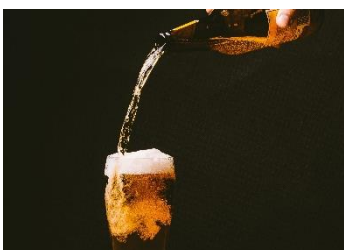
Cohabitation
