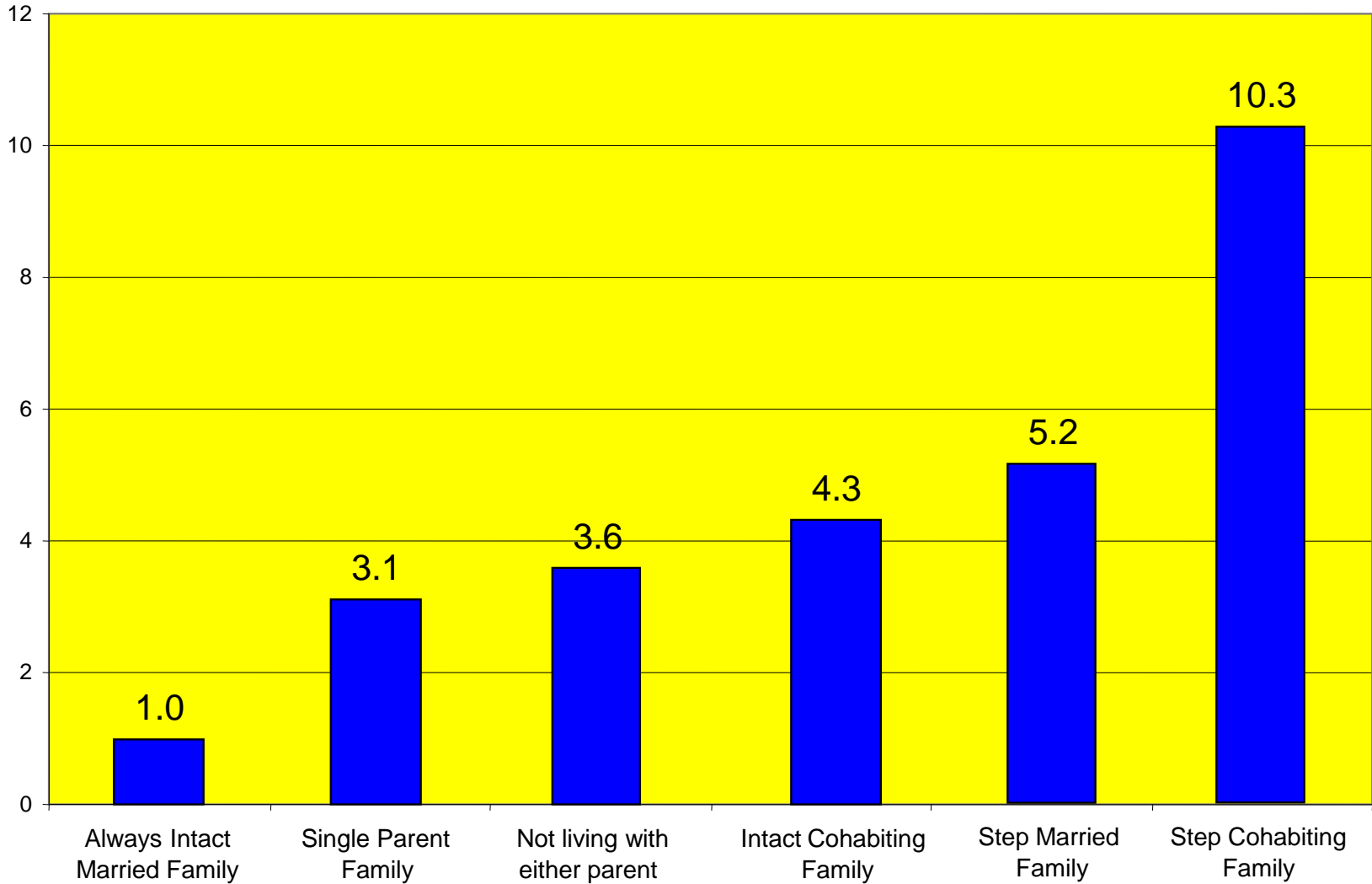


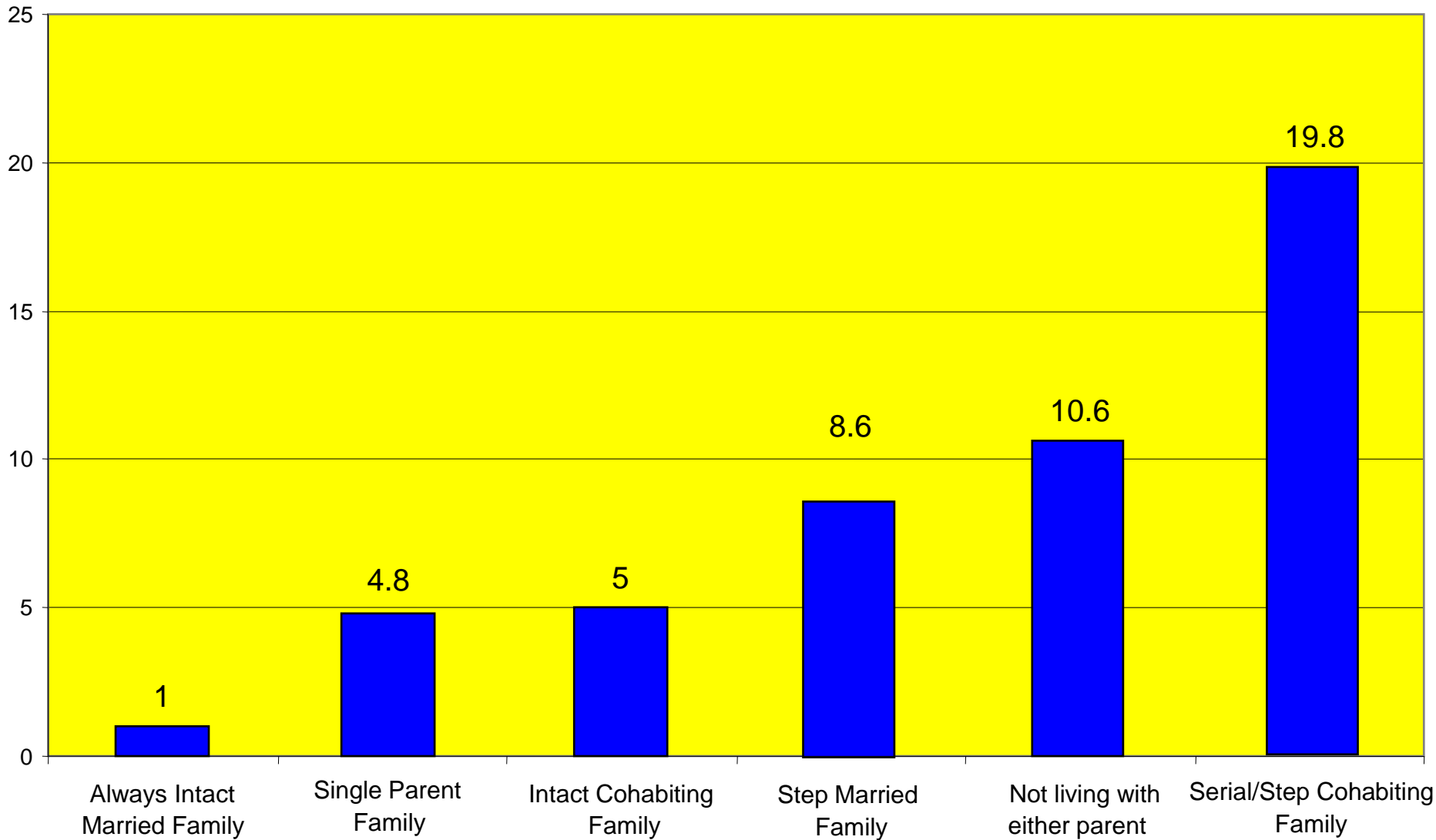
Relative Rates of Physical Abuse by Family Structure

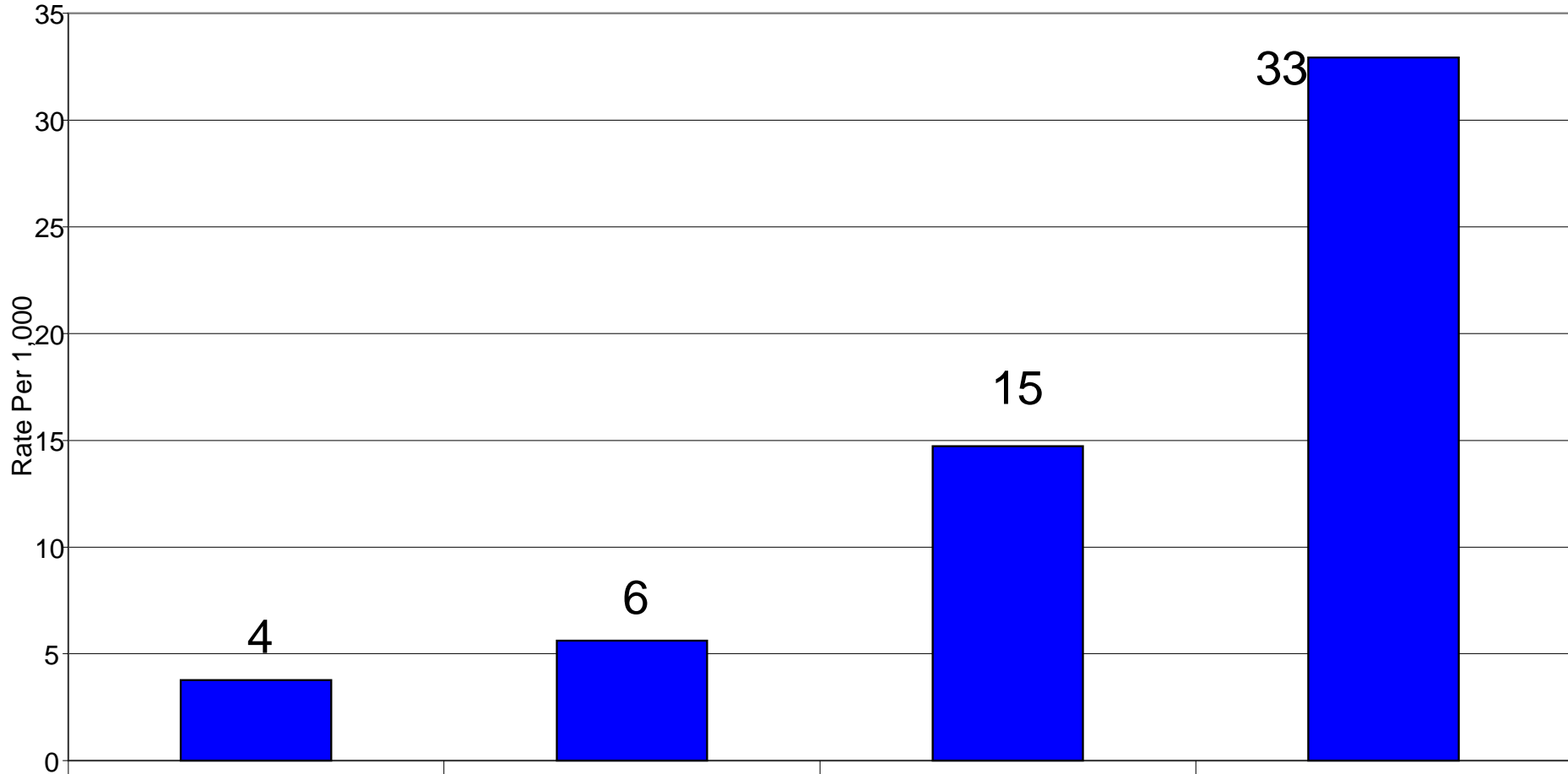

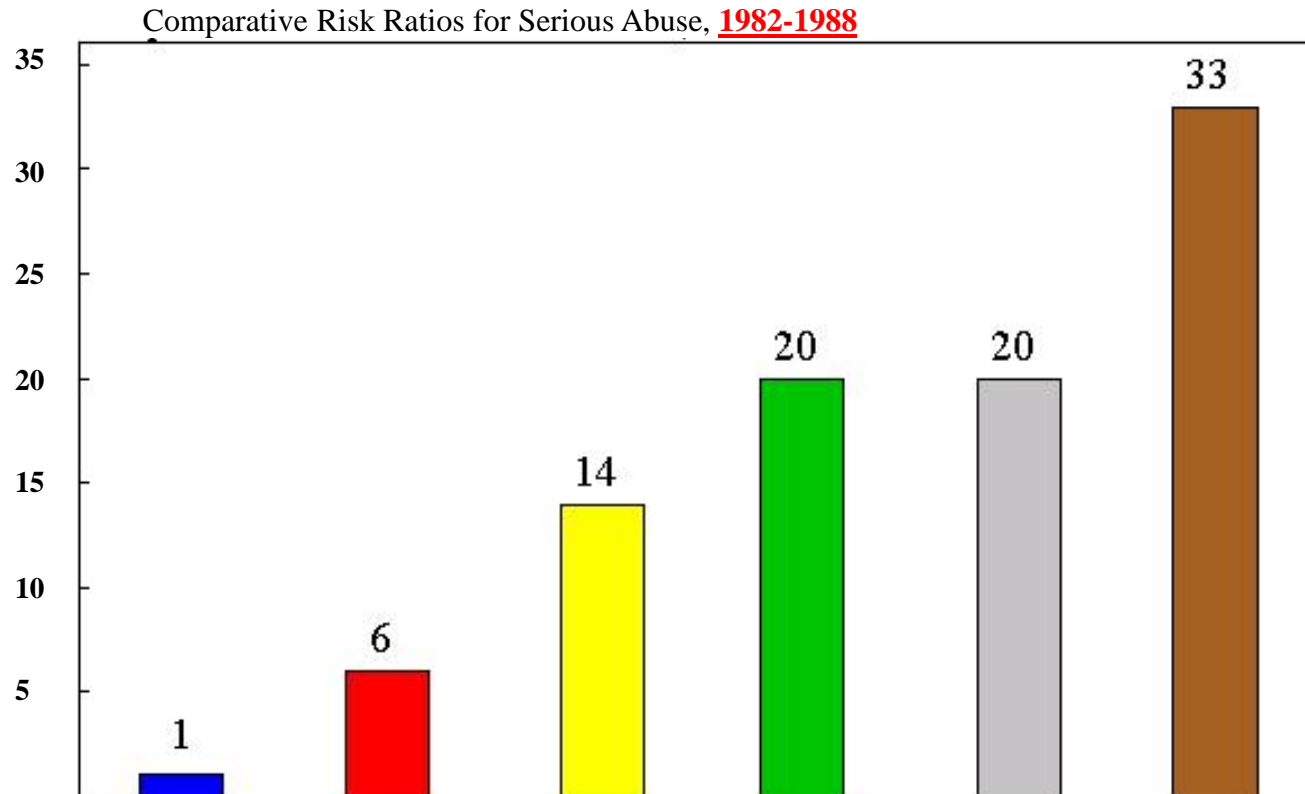


U.S: Partner / Spouse Violence Against Mothers Over 20 With Children under 12

In Britain, a Child Whose Biological Mother Cohabits was 73 Times More Likely to Suffer Fatal Abuse than a Child with Married Parents

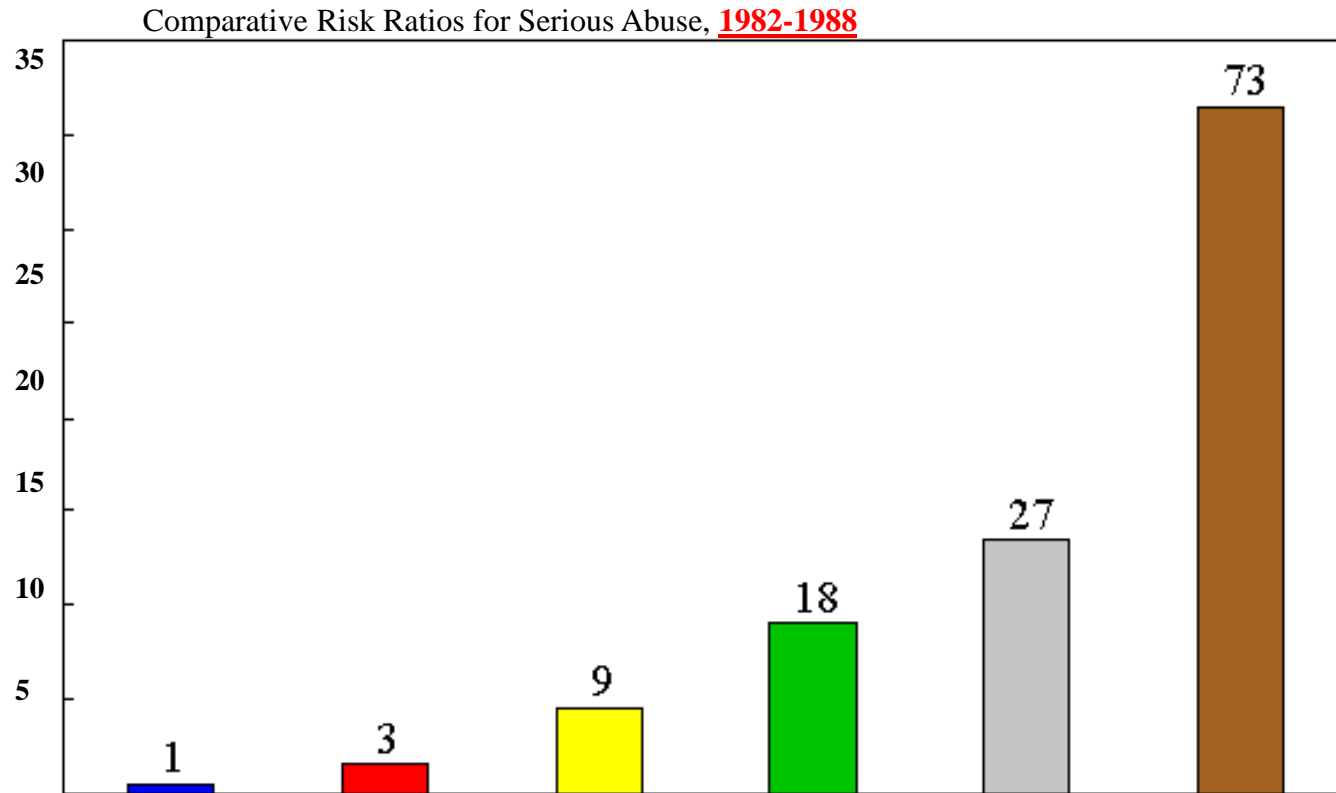

Distribution of IPV-Related Impacts Among Female Victims of Rape, Physical Violence, and/or Stalking by an Intimate Partner — NISVS 2010

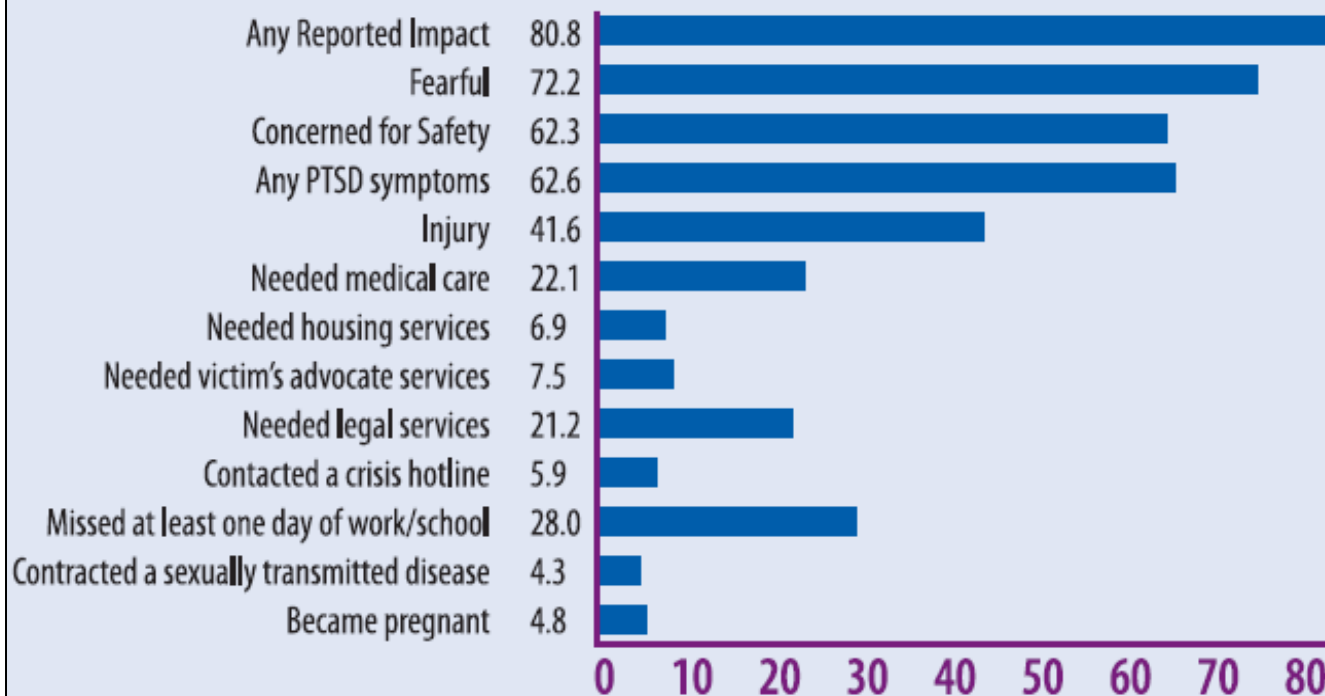
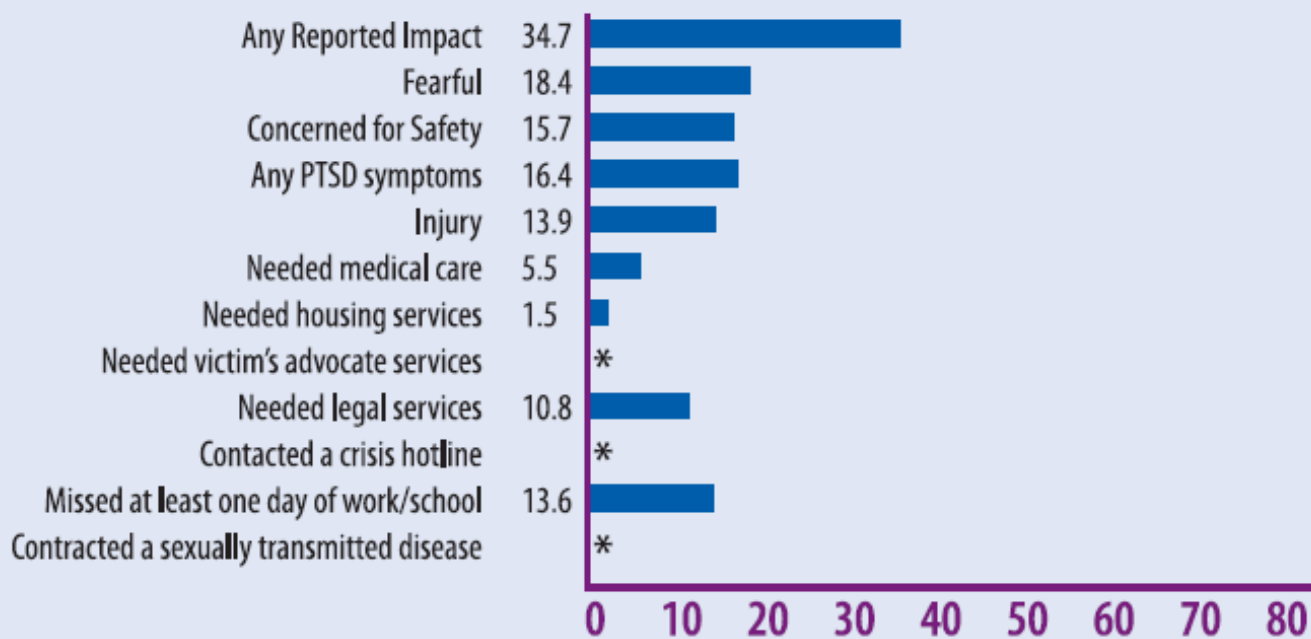

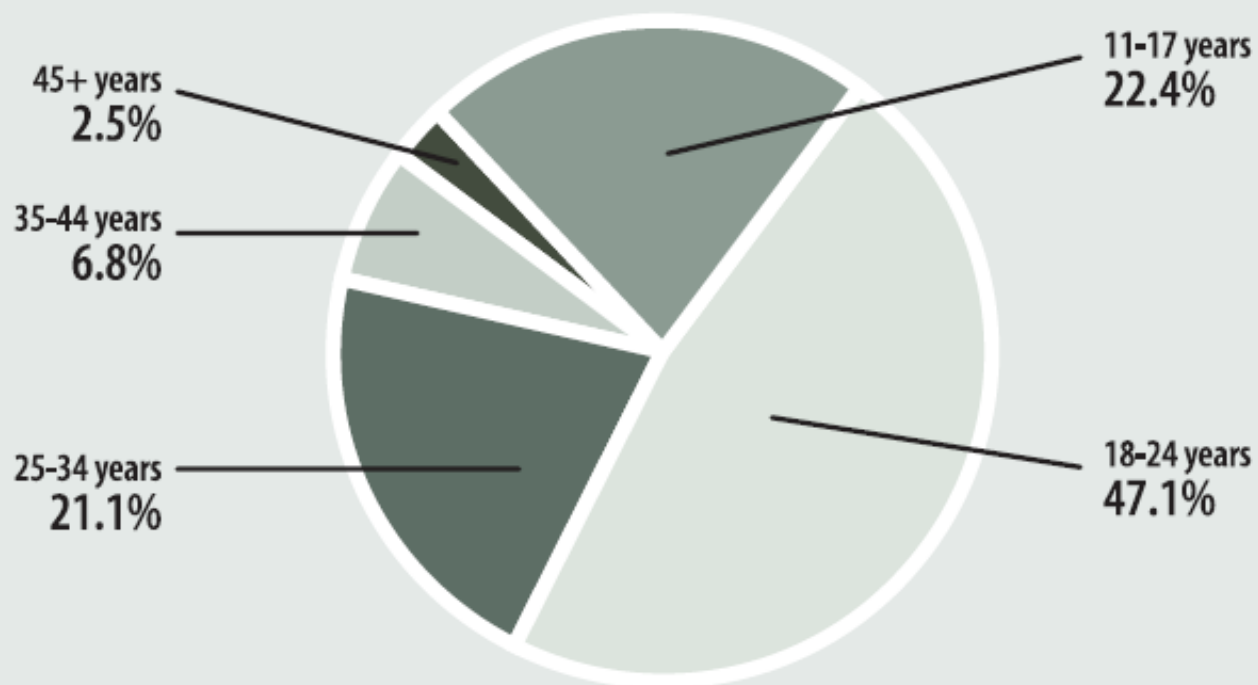
Distribution of IPV-Related Impacts Among Male Victims of Rape, Physical Violence, and/or Stalking by an Intimate Partner — NISVS 2010

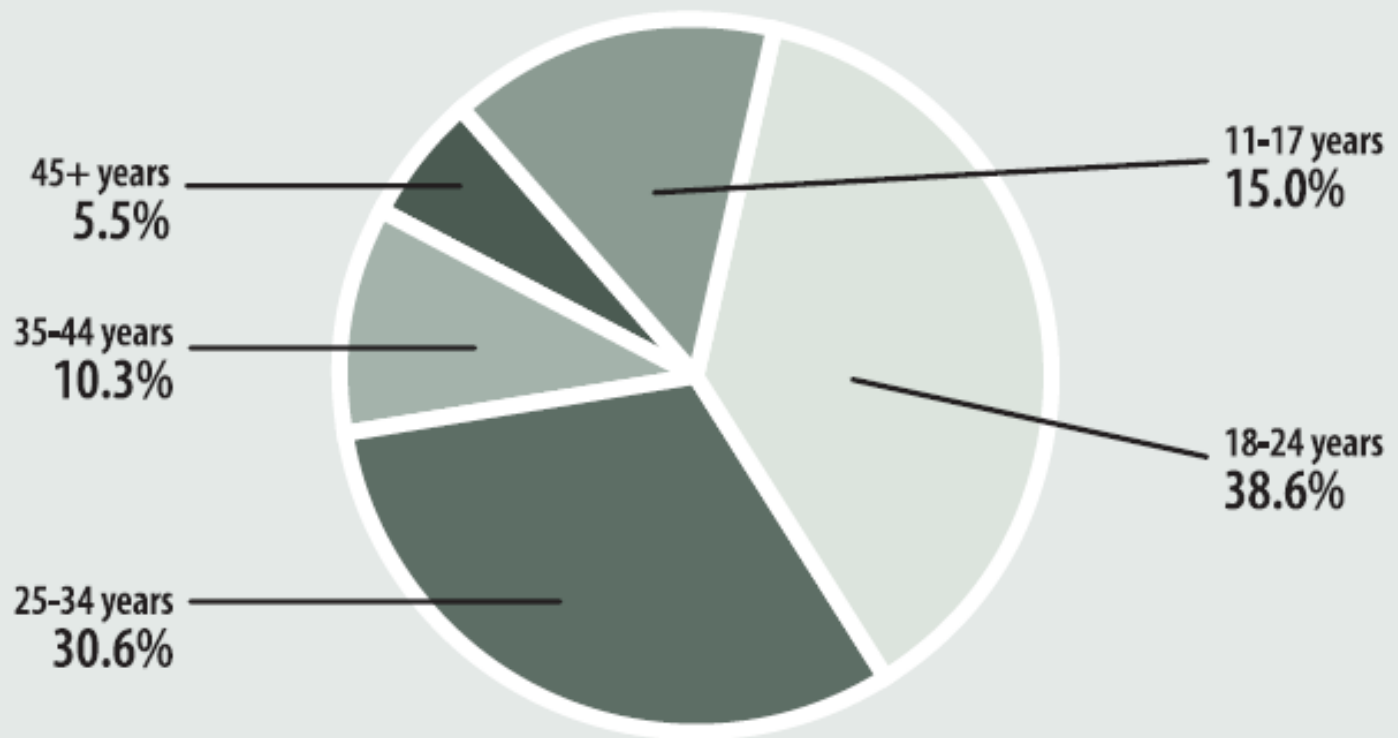

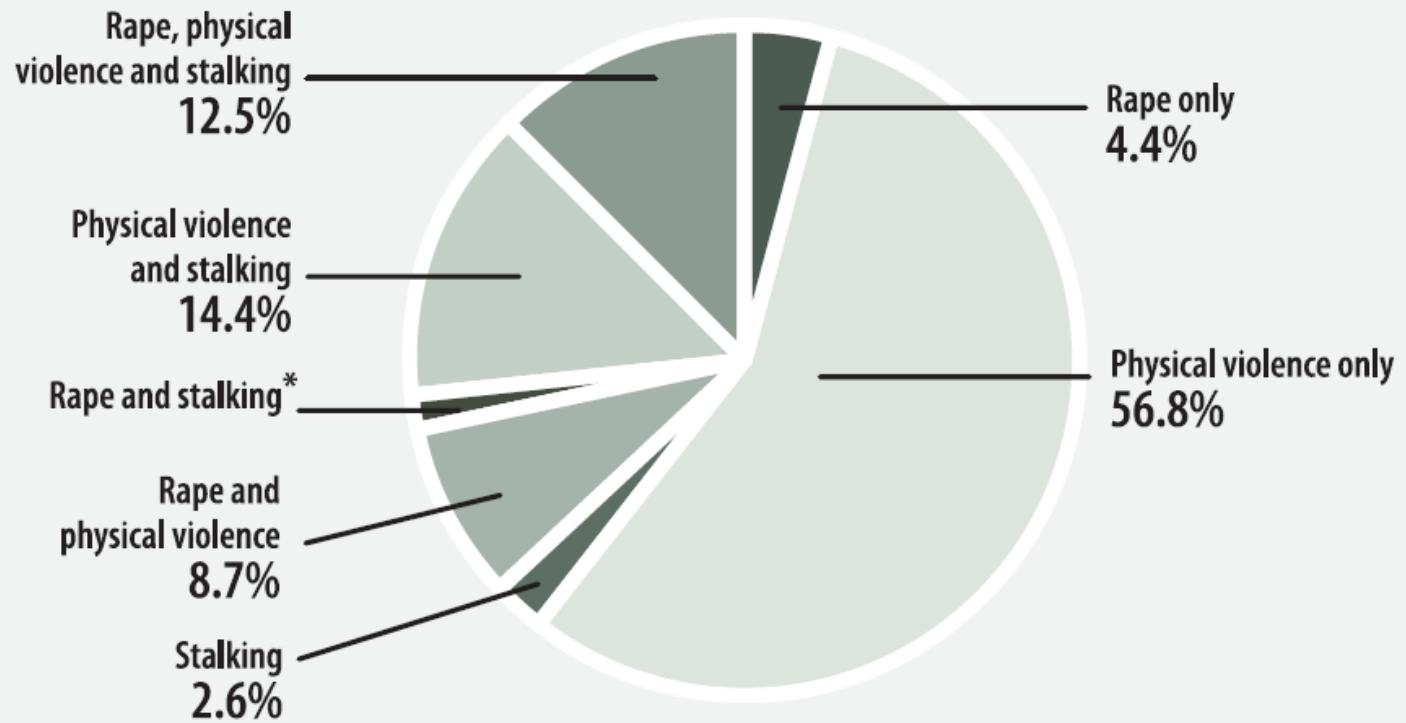

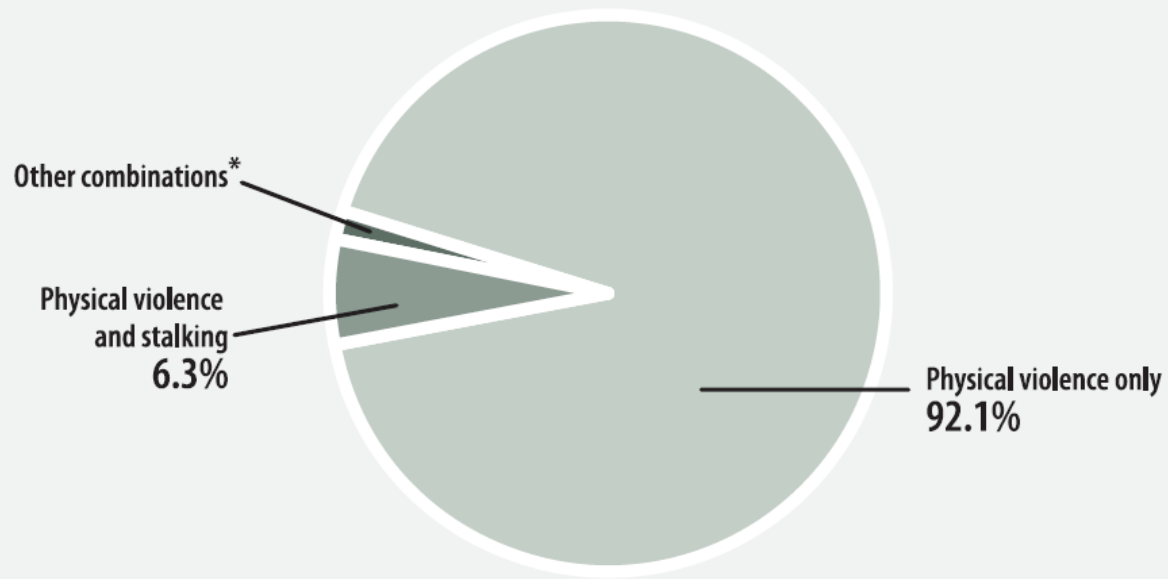
Overlap of Lifetime Intimate Partner Rape, Stalking, and Physical Violence Among Female Victims — NISVS 2010

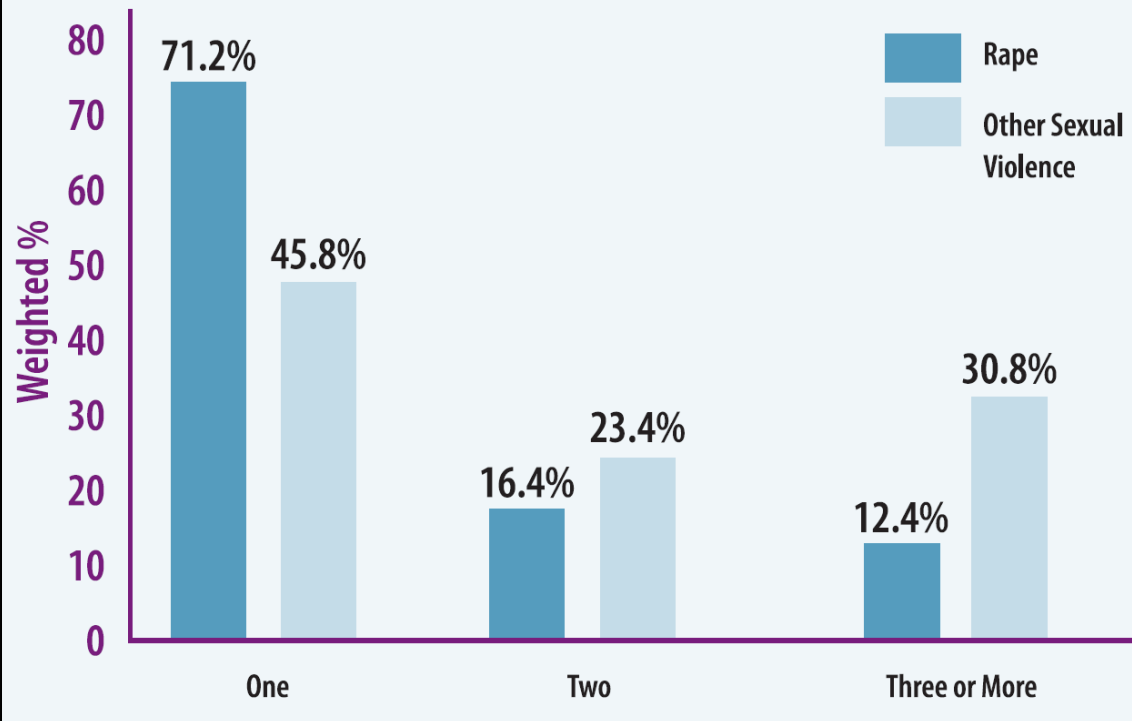
Overlap of Lifetime Intimate Partner Rape, Stalking, and Physical Violence Among Male Victims — NISVS 2010

Lifetime Number of Perpetrators Among Female Victims of Sexual Violence — NISVS 2010



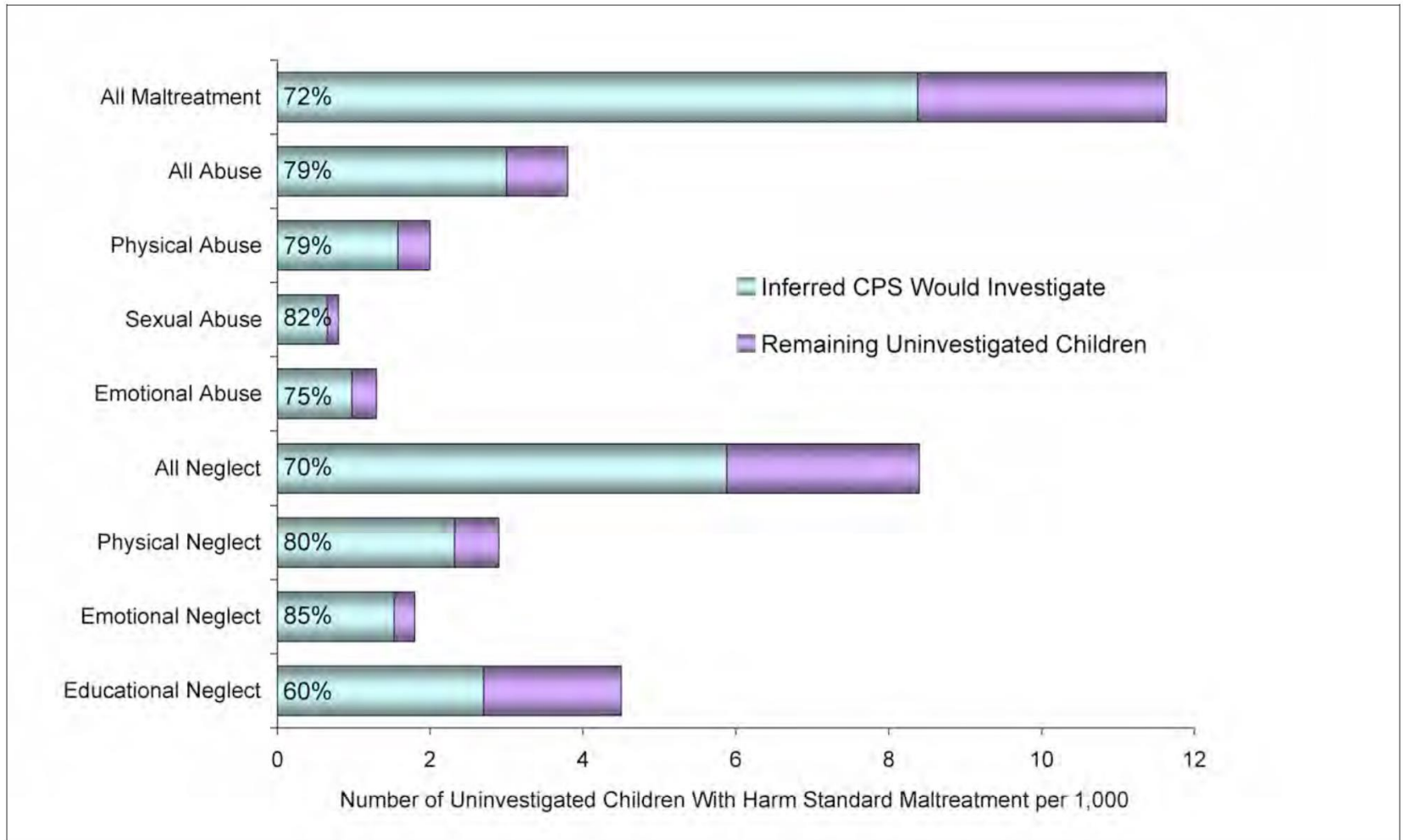


Figure 8–15. Uninvestigated Maltreated Children in the NIS–4 Whom CPS Probably Would Investigate According to Agencies’ Screening Criteria, by Harm Standard Maltreatment Category

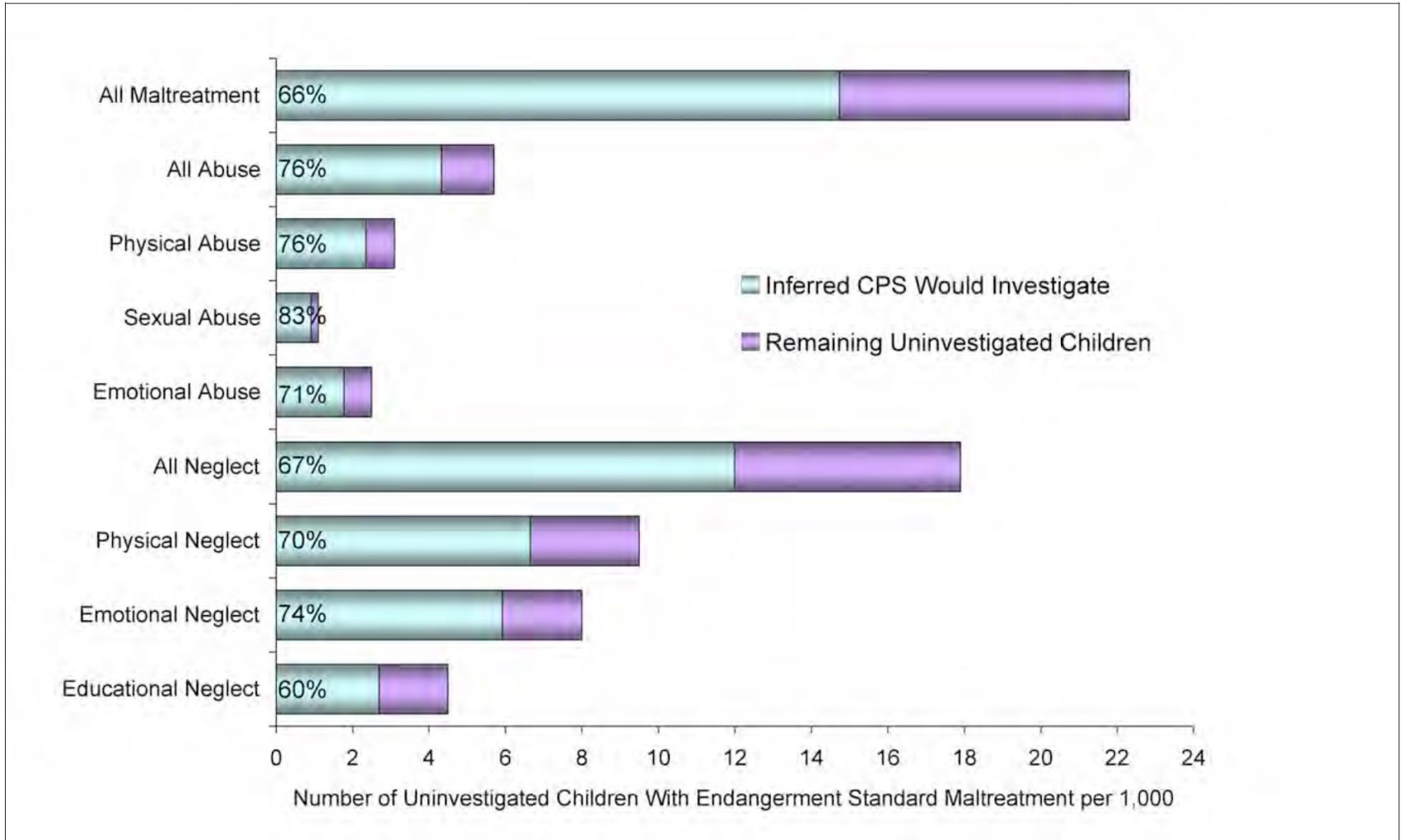


Figure 8–16. Uninvestigated Maltreated Children in the NIS–4 Whom CPS Probably Would Investigate According to Agencies’ Screening Criteria, by Endangerment Standard Maltreatment Category
