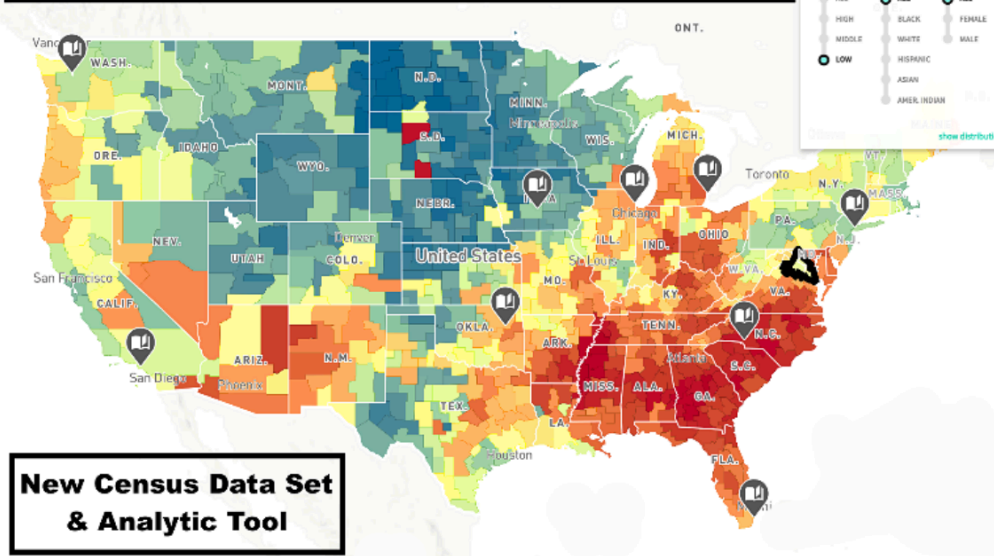

Findings from the census data reveal that the number of [two-parent families](#) in children's local population increase chances of upward considerably. The share of [single-parent](#) households also strongly decreases children's chances of upward mobility.
