Education and Religion

Although U.S. adults with college degrees tend to be less religious than others, college-educated *Christians* tend to be *more* religious, according to this Pew Research [report](#).



Age at Marriage and Marital Stability Varies by Race

Marital instability decreases as age at marriage increases up until ages 30-32 for white (non-Hispanic) women, ages 21-23 for Hispanic women, and ages 24-26 for black women, [report](#) researchers at the Institute of Labor Economics.



Childhood Family Structure and Future Economic Success

Adolescents raised in intact married families earn more, work more hours, and are more likely to marry as adults as compared to youth raised in single-parent homes, [according](#) to Robert Lerman, Joseph Price, and Brad Wilcox.
