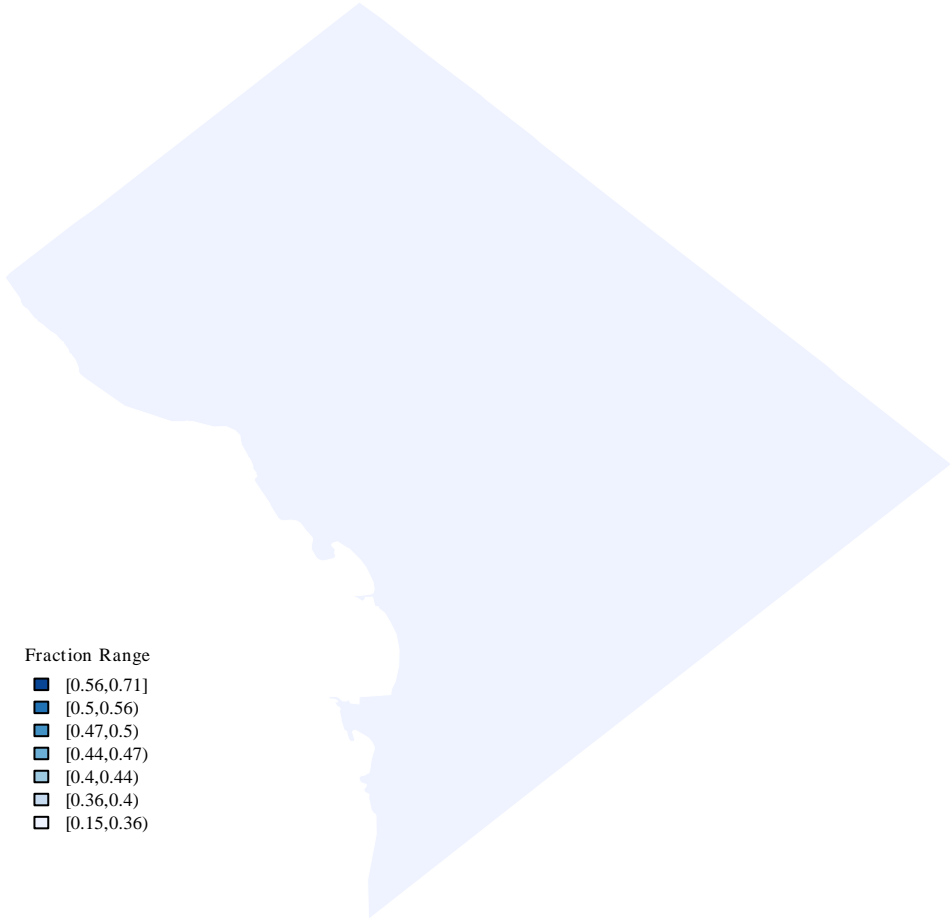

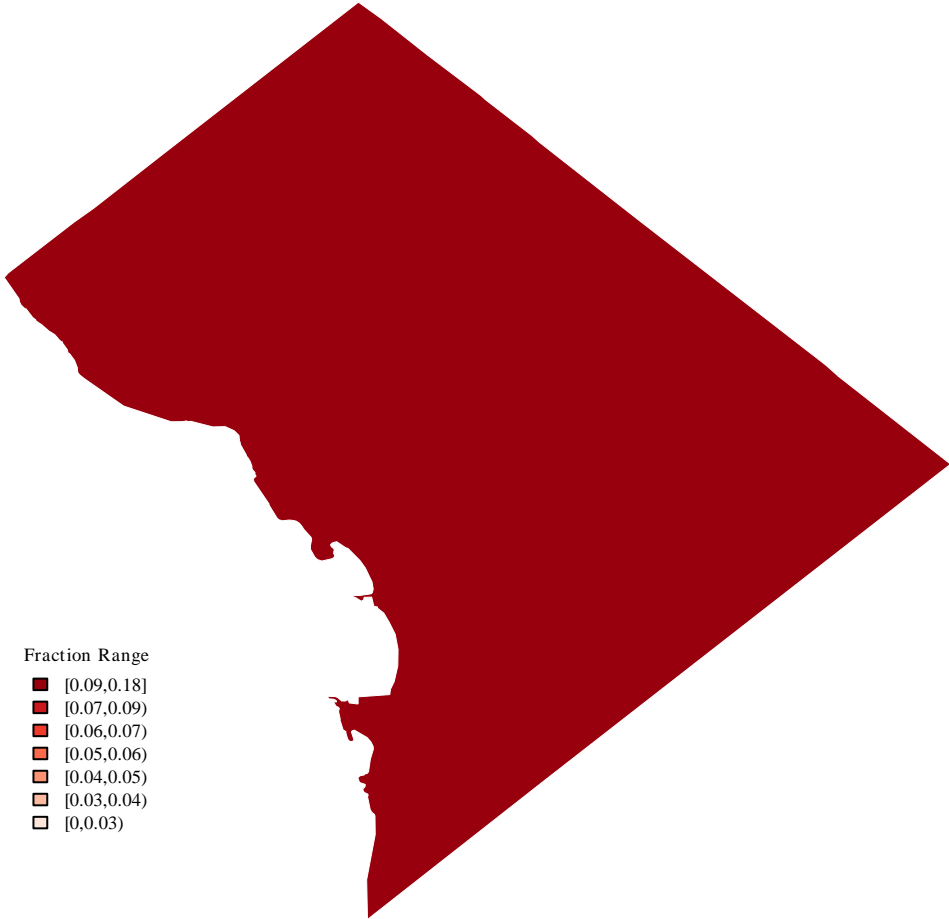

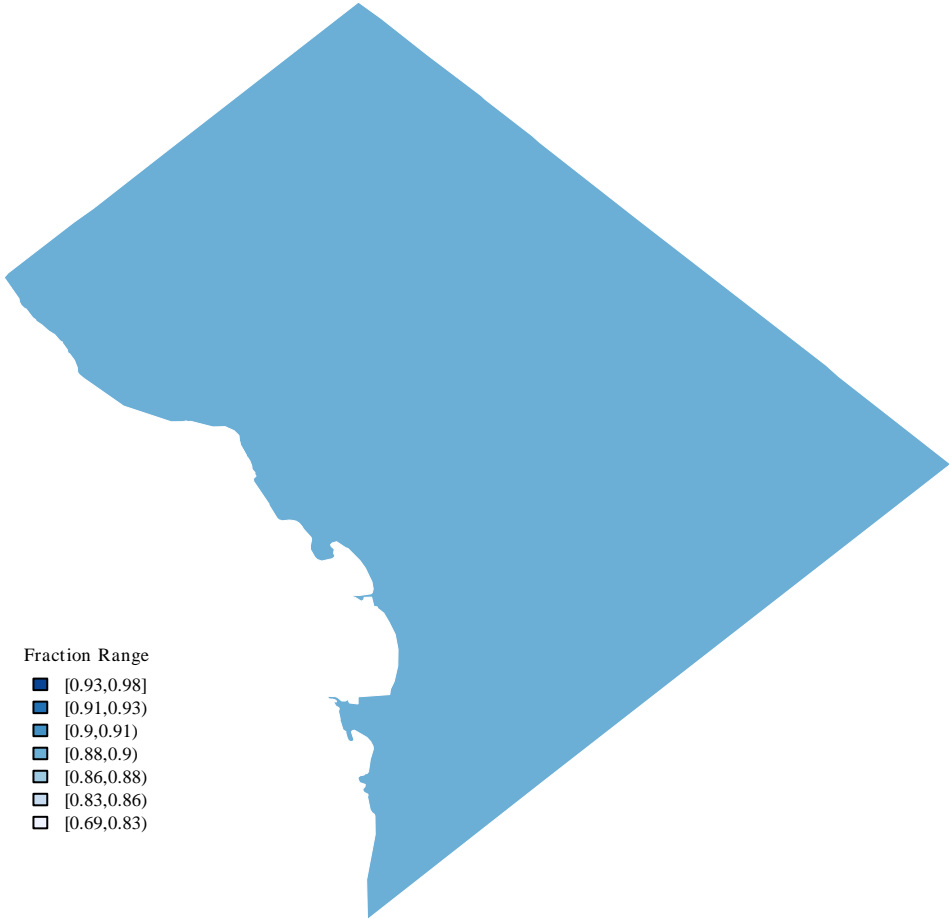
## Fraction of Families Intact



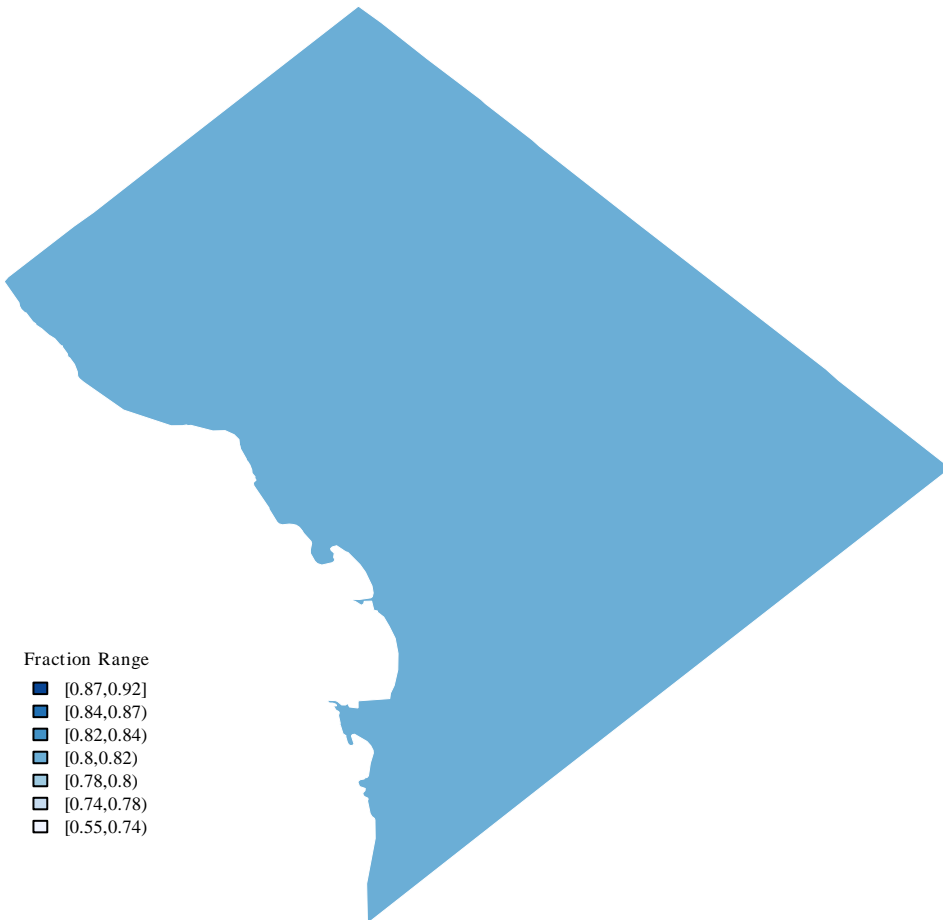

fraction of all births



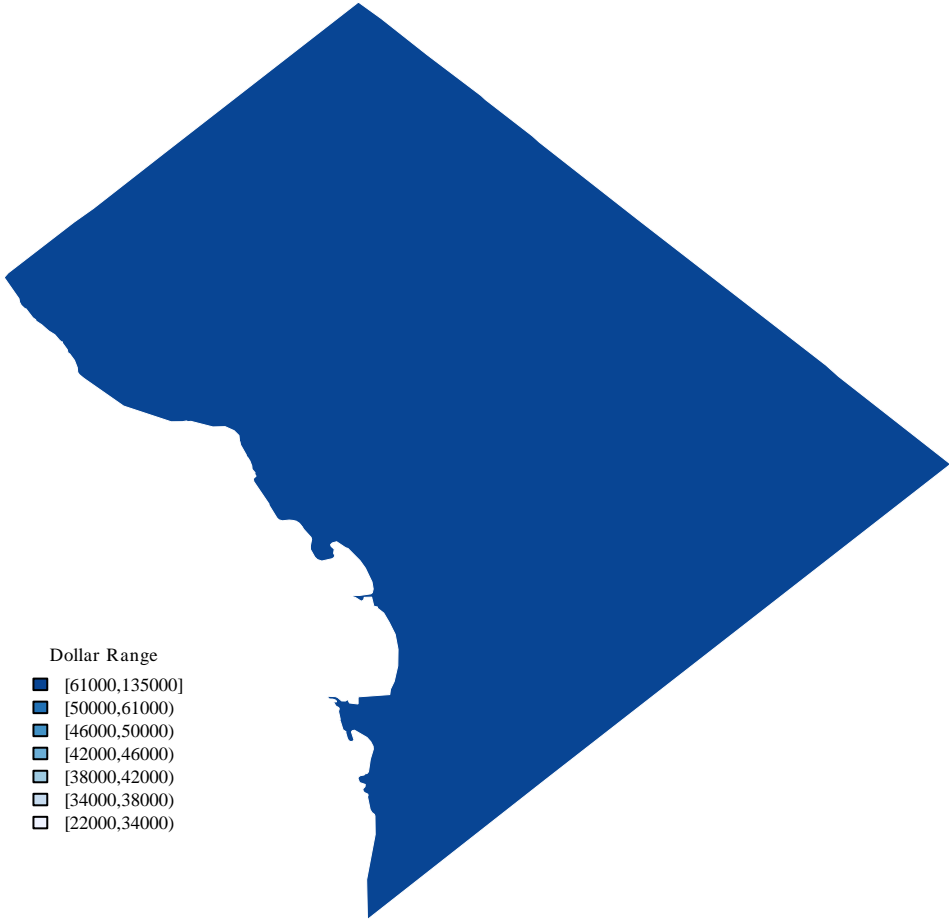
District of Columbia

fraction of 25- to 54- year- old men working

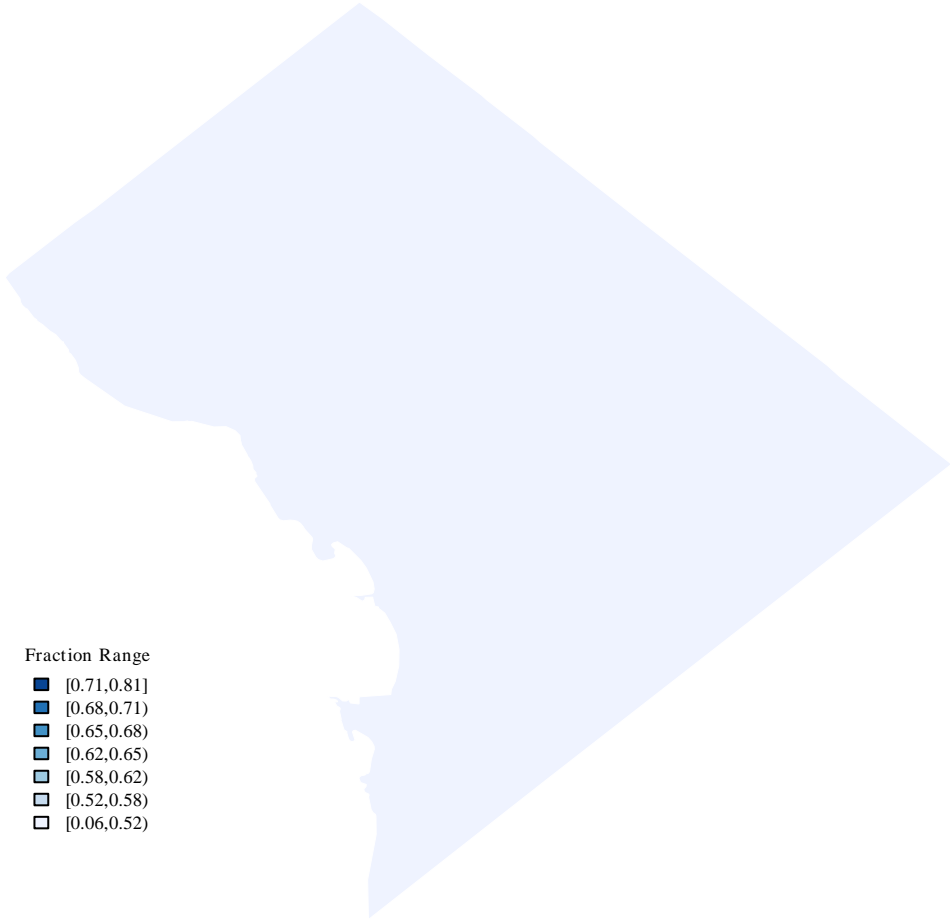

average per 25- to 54- year- old male

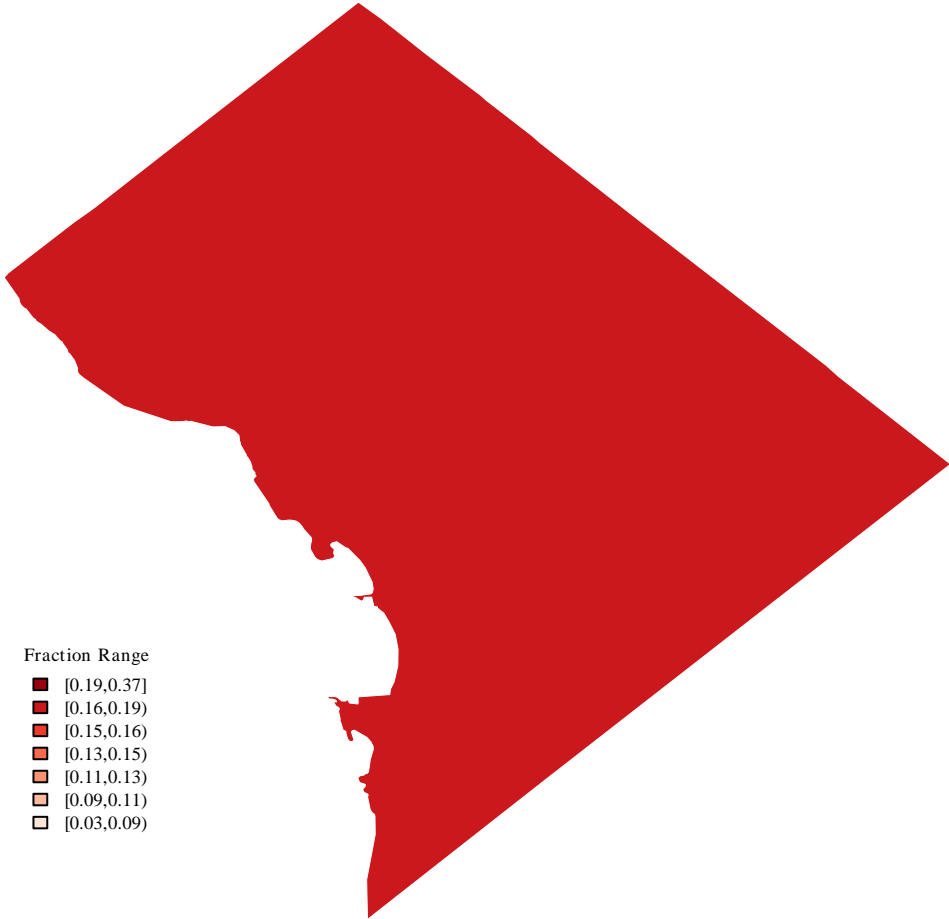

## Fraction of households owning home

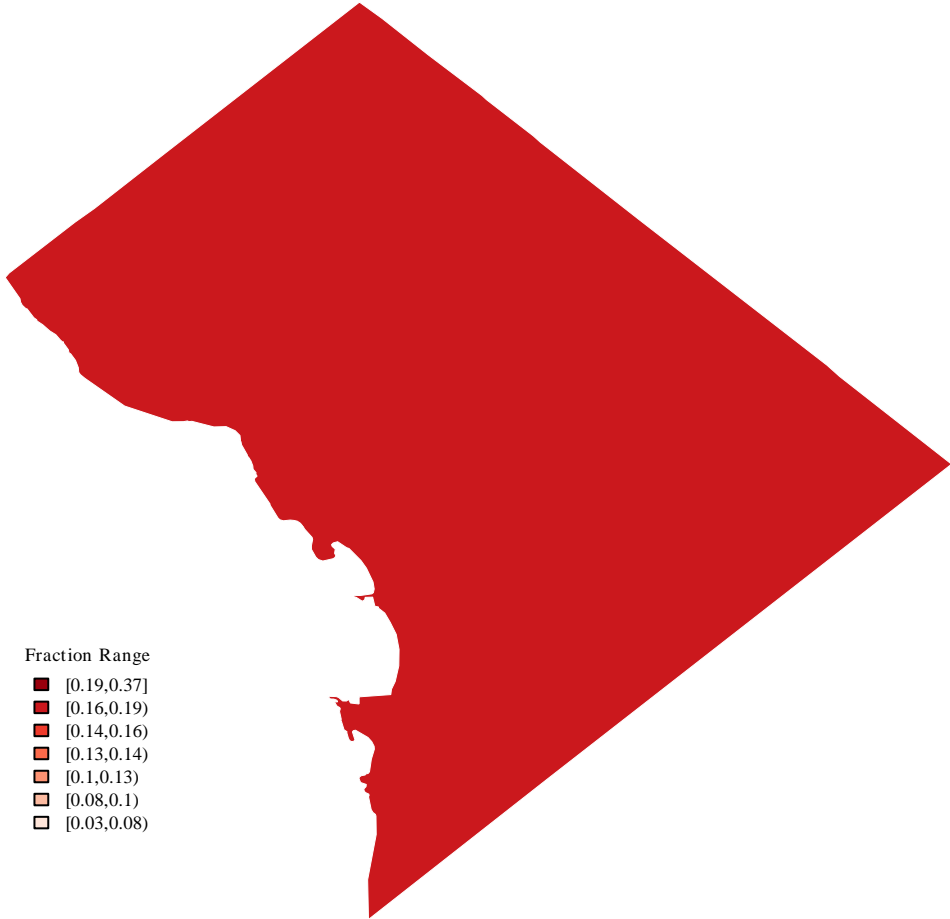

fraction of overall population

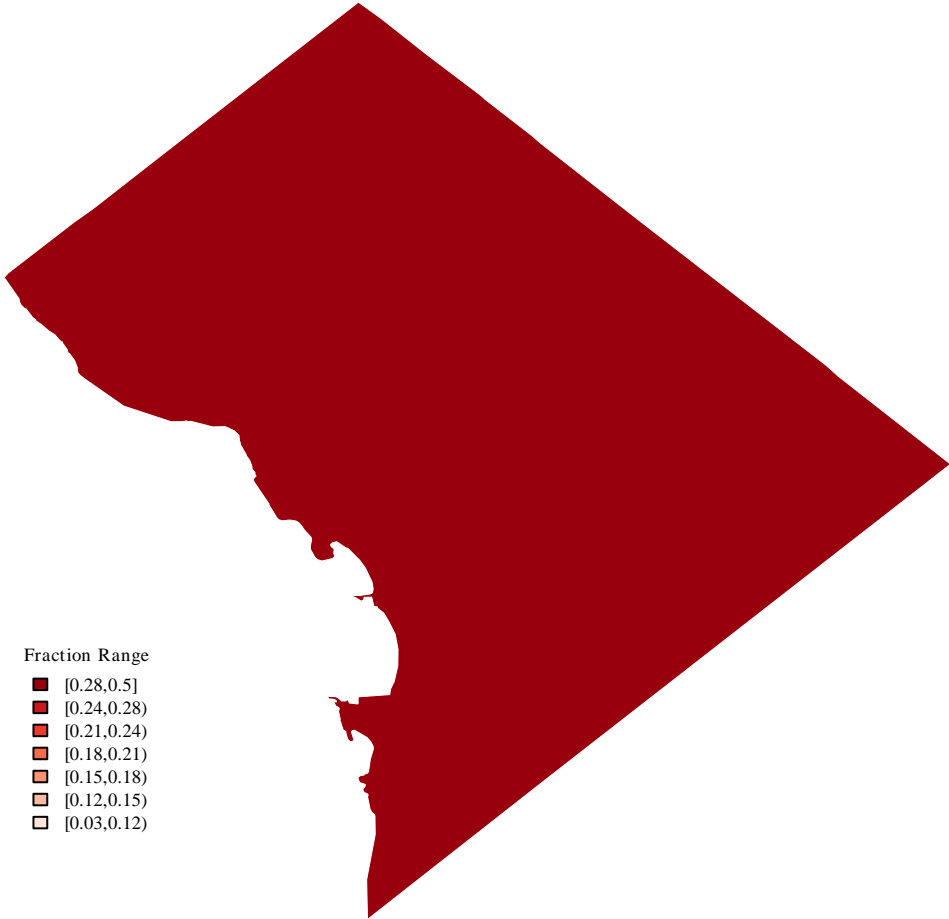




District of Columbia

fraction of 25- to 54-year-old females

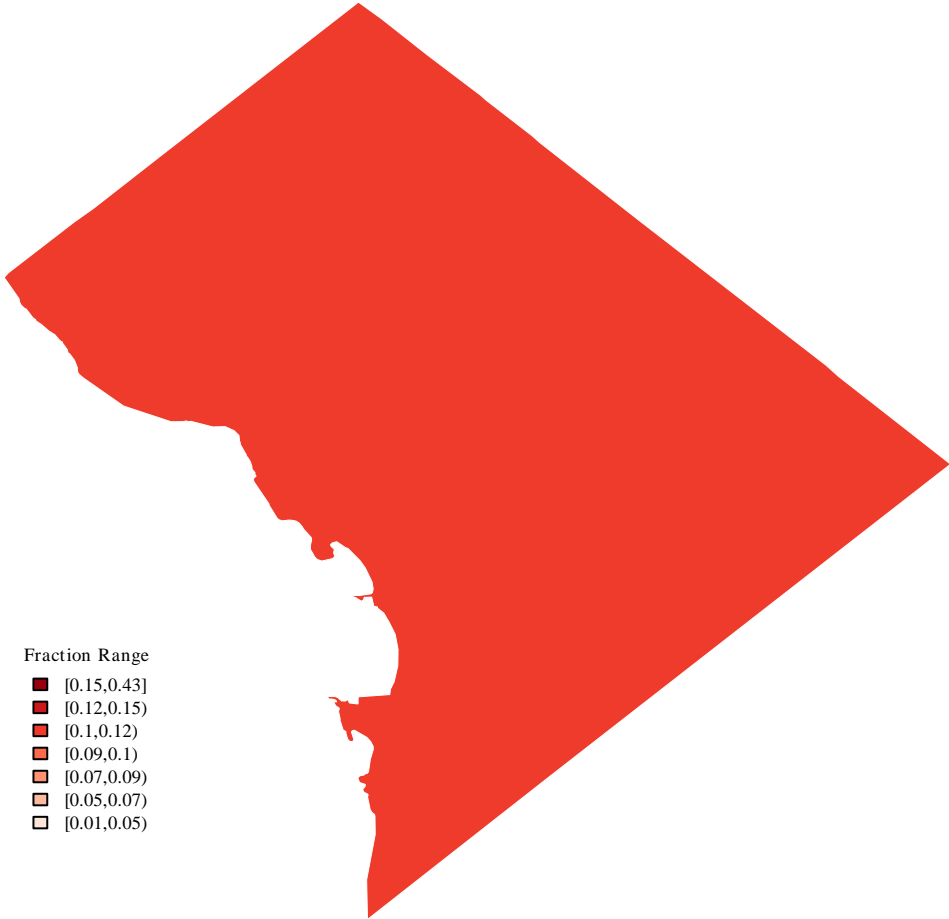

fraction of minors

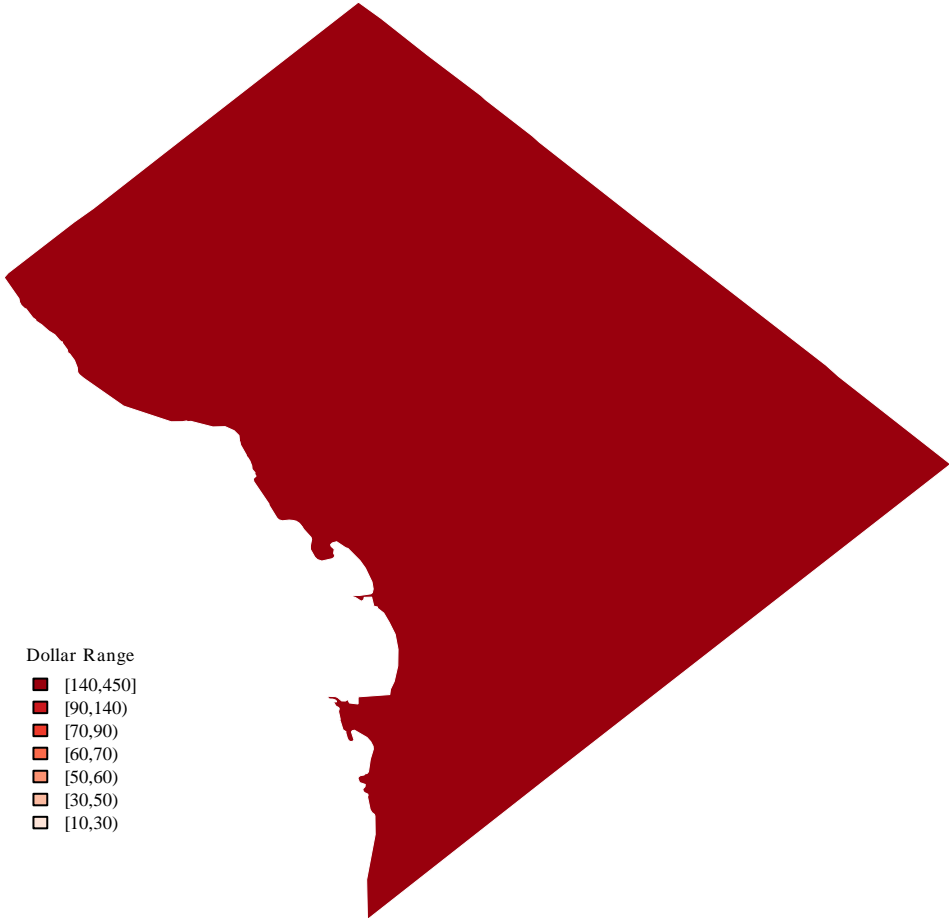

## Food stamp recipients, fraction of households

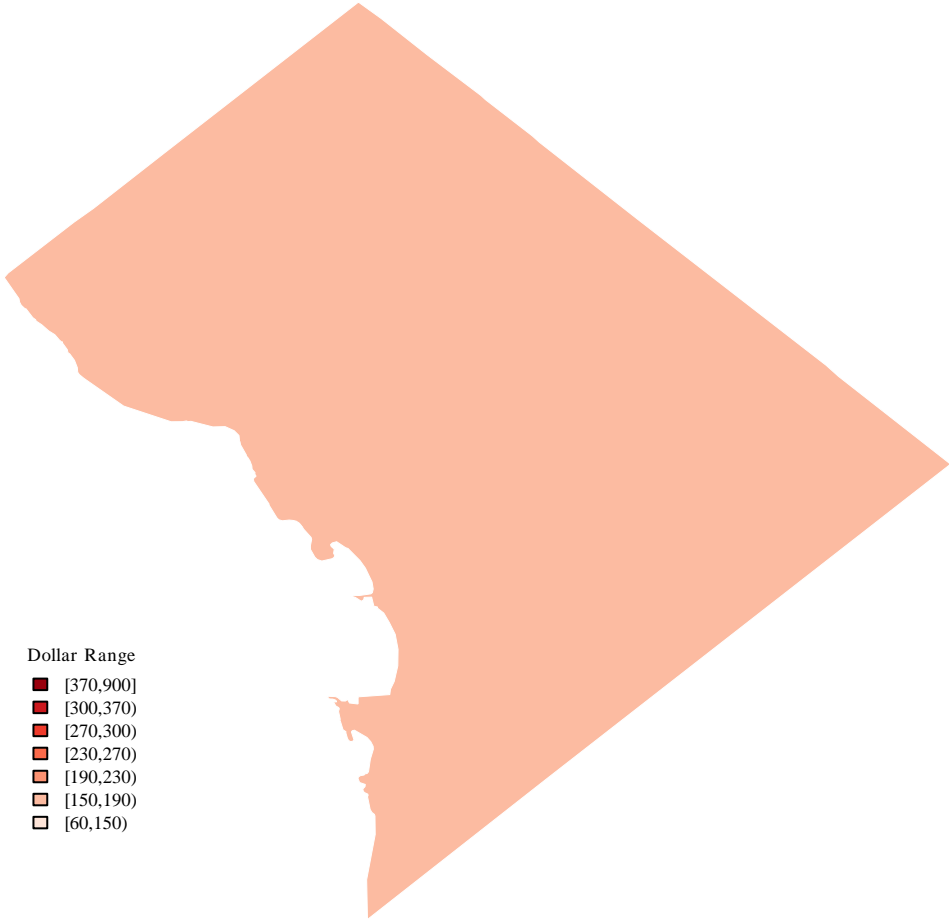

average per 25- to 54- year- old female

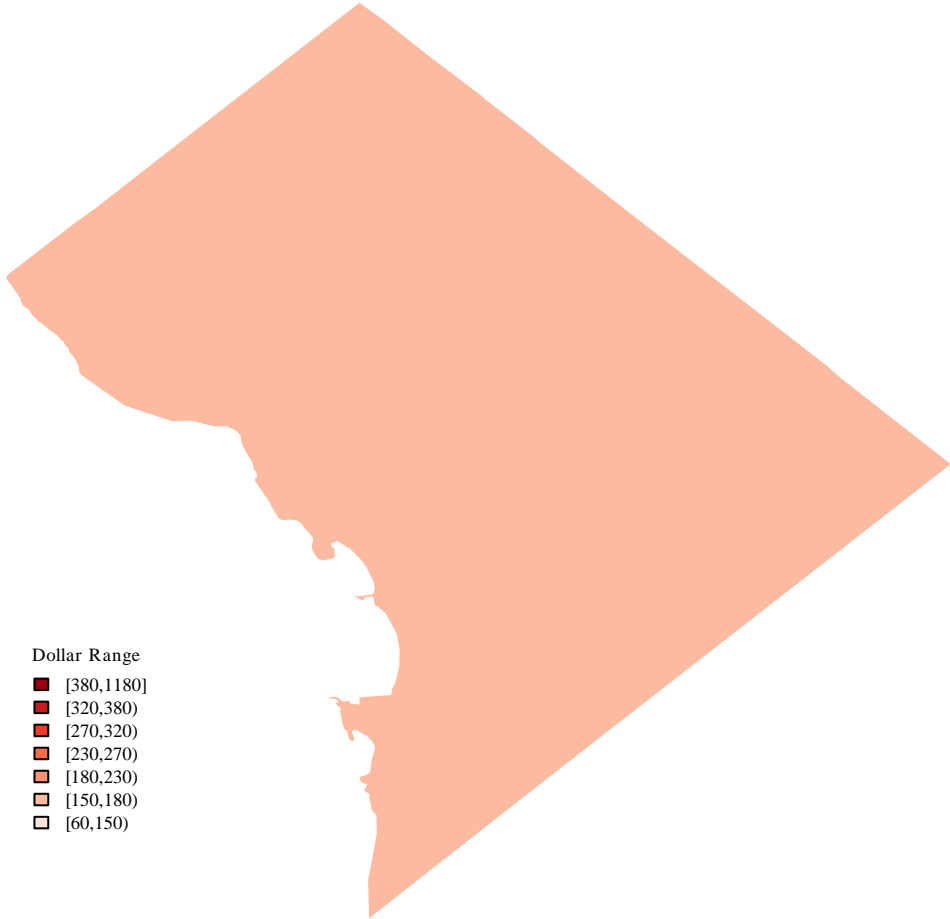

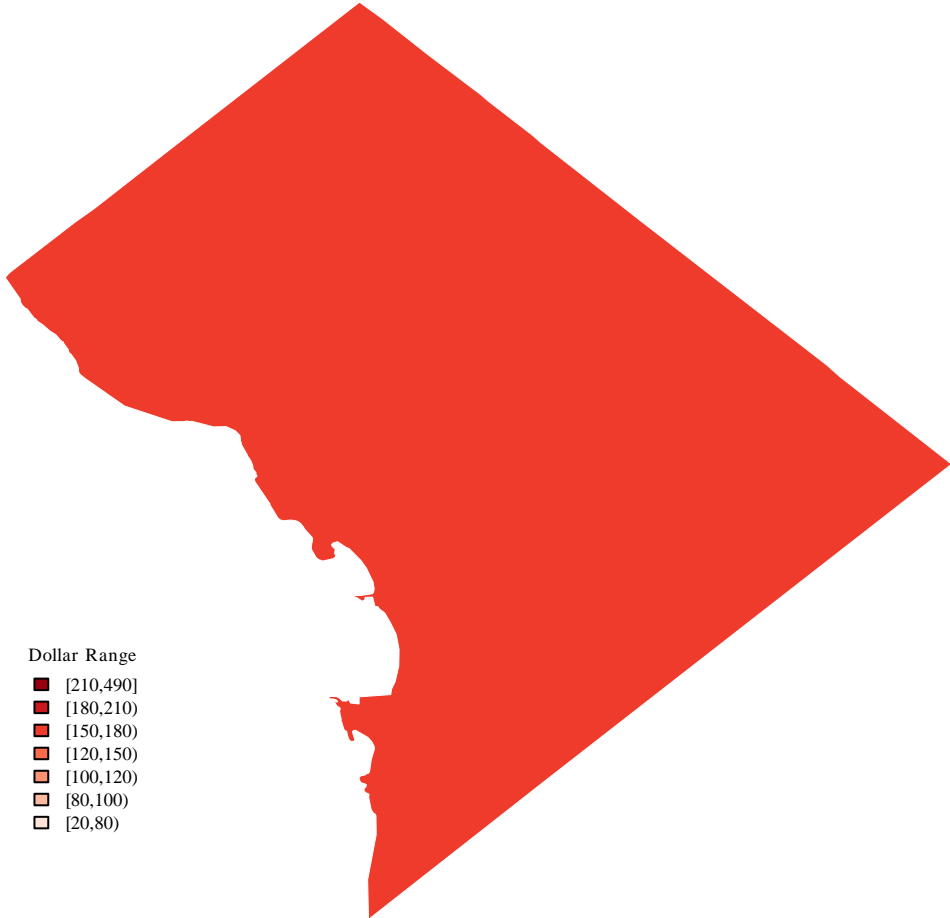
## Social Security Disability Income, average per 25- to 54-year-old



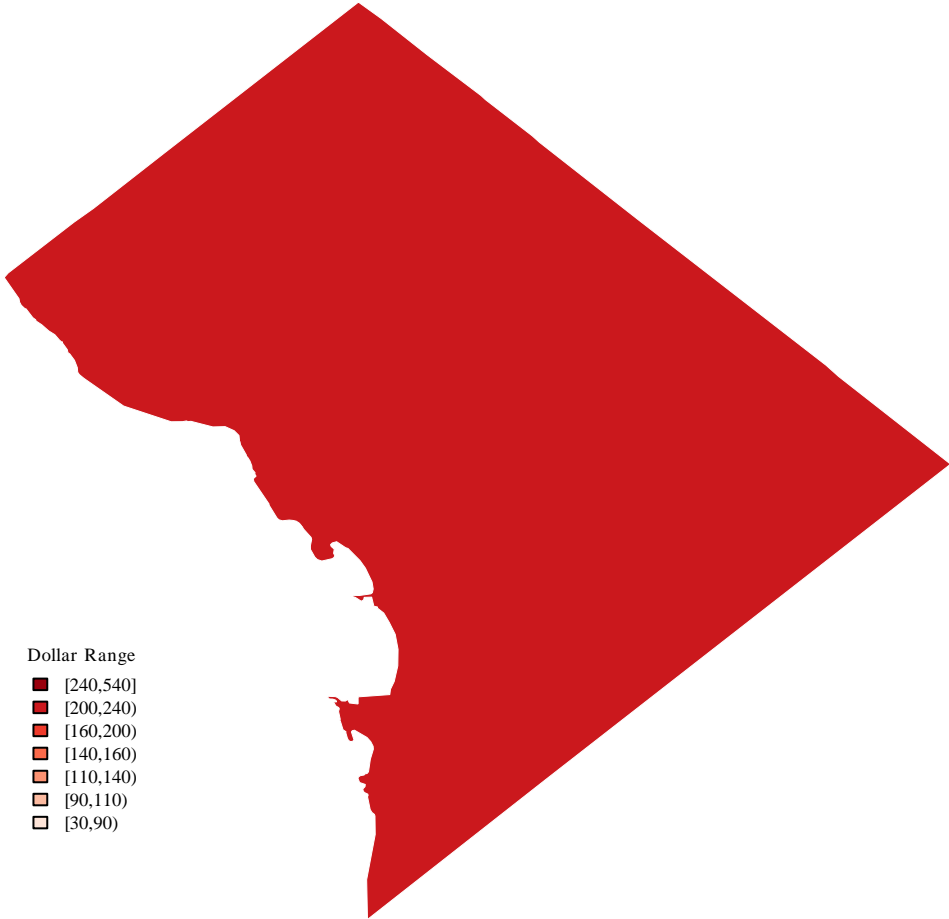

average per 25- to 54- year- old male

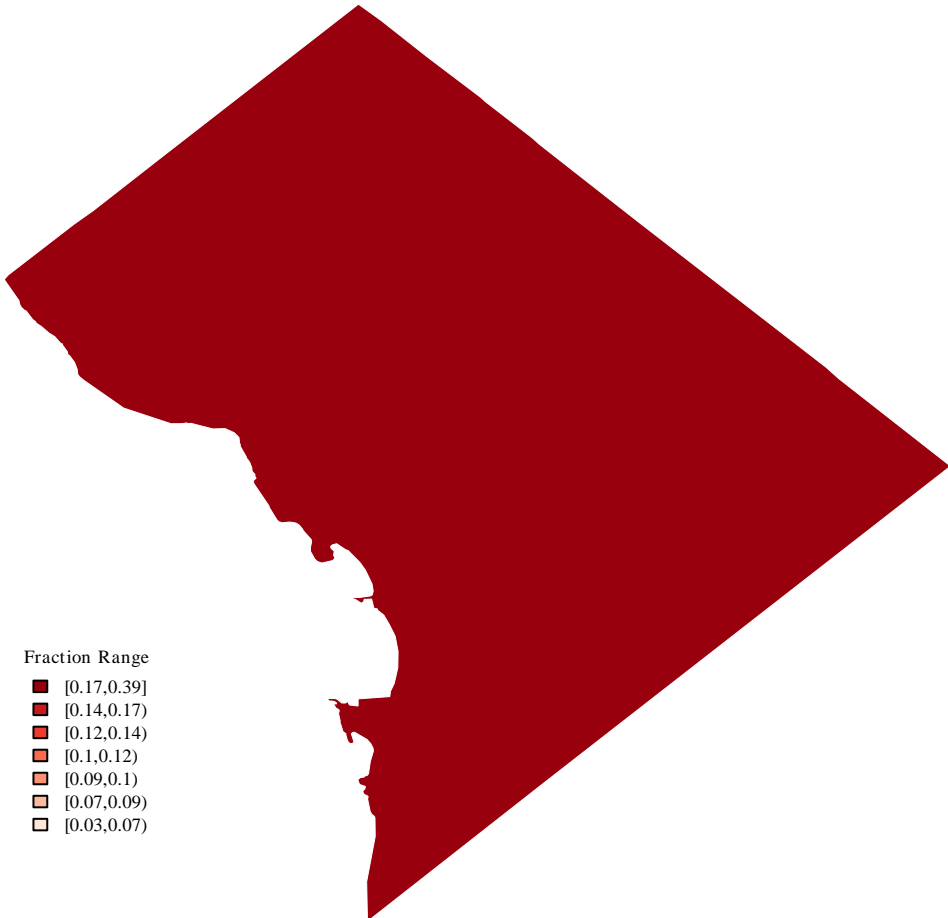

average per 25- to 54- year- old female

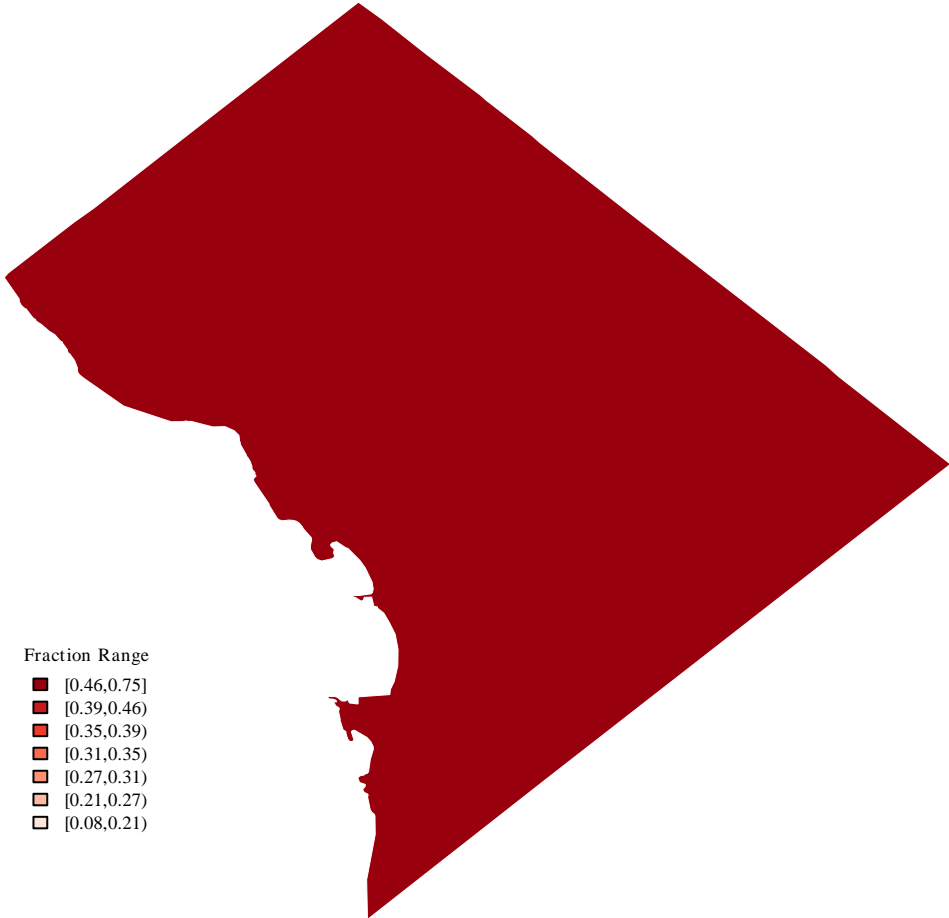




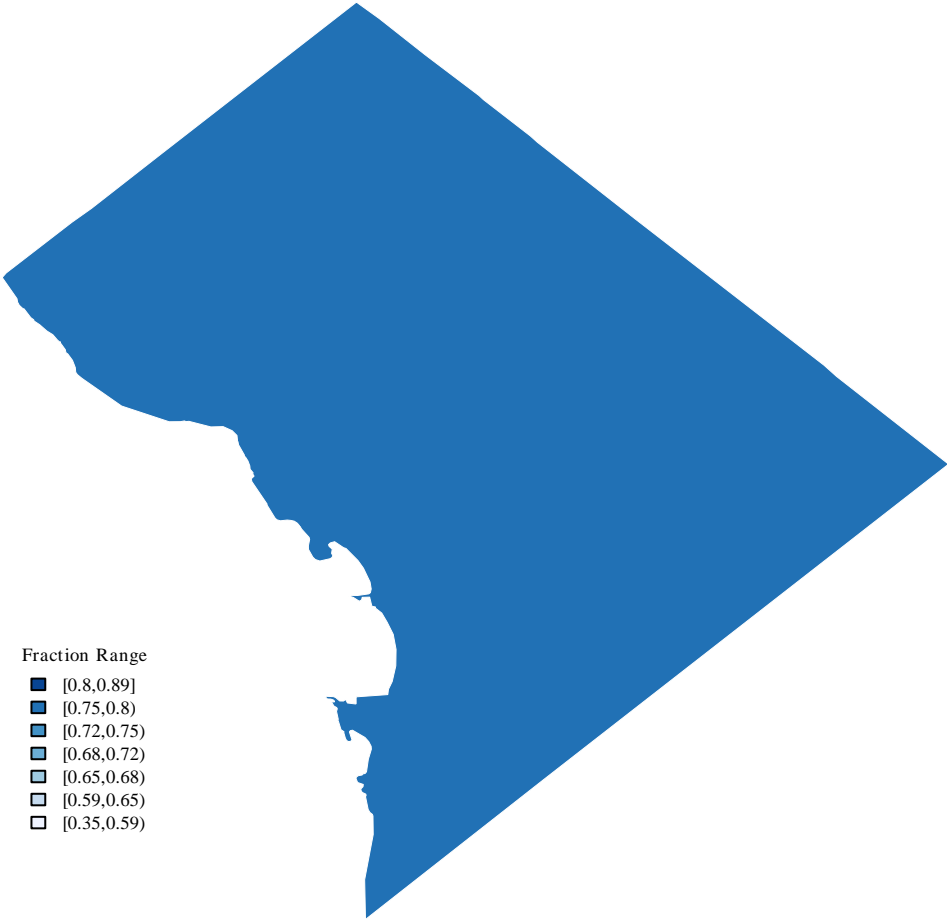
